### Read these instructions

A few weeks ago, in our home we needed to put together the base for our flat screen TV. When we opened the box, we found a set of instructions with these words on the front cover: *Before using your product, please read these instructions to prevent any damage. After carefully reading the instructions, we had our TV base put together and ready to use in a very short period of time. I have found that it is very helpful to read the instructions before I begin a project.*

God has given us, as His people, similar good advice for our lives. In Joshua 1:8 we read these words that God said to Joshua as he was beginning in his role as the leader of God's people. *Keep this Book of the Law always on your lips; meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything written in it. Then you will be prosperous and successful. God is reminding Joshua that he needs to read the instructions before he begins to lead Israel as they conquer the Promised Land.*

Many in our congregation have accepted the challenge this year of reading through the Bible. Some are using various versions of the One Year Bible which offers readings from the Old and New Testaments plus a reading from Psalms and Proverbs every day. A few others in our congregation are using a chronological Bible as they read through the Bible in one year. Either way, those who are reading their Bibles every day are reading the instructions that God wants us to know so that we can live lives that honor Him.

A project like reading through the Bible can seem like a lot of fun when we start out doing this in the beginning of the year. Reading Genesis 1 and Matthew 1 on New Year's Day is exciting as we look forward to a great year of Bible reading. But we are now approaching our 5<sup>th</sup> month of reading the Bible. In the One Year Bibles we have read through some incredibly strange words of law in Leviticus and Deuteronomy. We have also read some pretty alarming words from God about how he will punish Israel if they are not faithful to him. We are now reading the books of history – Joshua, Judges, Ruth, etc. – which include a lot of stories of violence and death. And we have a long way to go before we get to the end of this reading on December 31.

I would like to remind and challenge all in our church family of the importance of *reading the instructions. Sometimes those instructions can be boring (as in Leviticus) and sometimes those instructions can be rather distressing (as in the book of Judges!). But let's all renew our commitment to reading through the Bible in one year as we seek to learn and follow God's instructions for our lives. If Joshua needed to keep this Book of the Law on his lips, I am sure that we also want to keep God's word on our lips as well as on our hearts and minds.*

If you would like a little encouragement for this journey, I will be happy to add you to our One Year Bible Reading email group. Sometimes a few words of encouragement can be very helpful as we travel this journey through the Bible together. Just remember these words: *Read these instructions before using your product....*

## Anniversary Anecdote

### Refugee Resettlement

The Anniversary Anecdote for May focuses on Refugees. Mechanic Grove has a long history of helping people in need. Refugees from other places certainly are people in need. People fleeing famine, the destruction of war, or persecution for their beliefs. These people have suffered and experienced tremendous hardships when all they want is what we all want, to live their lives in peace and provide for their families.

I went online and looked up Bible passages about sojourners and loving our neighbors as ourselves. Not surprisingly I found dozens and dozens of references. Isn't this at the very core of what it means to be a Christian? Here are two such passages:

Exodus 22:21

"You shall not wrong a sojourner or oppress him, for you were sojourners in the land of Egypt"

Malachi 3:5

**"Then I will draw near to you for judgment. I will be a swift witness** against the sorcerers, against the adulterers, against those who swear falsely, against those who oppress the hired worker in his wages, the widow and the fatherless, **against those who thrust aside the sojourner**, and do not fear me, says the Lord of hosts.

So, we know that our work with refugees goes back to at least 1947 because we have a picture of a "displaced persons" family from that date. We also have many photos of our efforts to resettle families from Southeast Asia, Eastern Europe and Asia. Some of the work continues with assistance we have given to help support an Afghan family. As long as people of the world continue to wage war and suppress others, we will continue to find opportunities to help.


