Expectations

I can still remember the tradition of Easter at my home growing up. My brothers and I would wake up Easter morning expectantly, check our Easter baskets, look for eggs that were hidden, have breakfast and then off to church. Then in the afternoon it was off to Grandma's house for more candy and more egg hunting. So Easter became associated with candy, gifts and eggs. My expectation for Easter was candy, eggs and a Sunday morning church service. Somewhere in the midst of all the trappings of Easter was the miracle of the resurrection. Later when I was a young adult, I spoke at an Easter Sunrise service. My first sermon came early on Easter morning outside the New Providence Church of God at a sunrise service. Since then, I have enjoyed Easter Sunday and celebrate it each year with great expectation. Easter is resurrection Sunday and I can hardly wait...

Expectations are important. When our expectations aren't met, we are unhappy. When Jesus died on Good Friday, the expectations that many people had for Jesus died too. So, the women head to the tomb early Sunday morning for one thing—to embalm their friend. They weren't on their way to a sunrise service. They weren't going to worship and sing songs of praise. They weren't real excited about the future. Their world had collapsed before them. With Jesus death, went their expectations and their hope. Now, it was time to complete the task, anoint the body and move on. As they walked in the darkness of the morning, they moved briskly to the tomb. They expected to find the tomb and Jesus body in it. Instead, they found the stone rolled away and Jesus' body nowhere to be found. They didn't expect either. But not only was the stone rolled away but the tomb was empty. Luke 24:3 says clearly that they did not find the body of Jesus. Now I have always tried to wonder what I would have thought that morning if I was there. If my heart was burdened with sorrow and loss and I expected to find a body and there was none, what would my reaction have been? Would I have been disappointed? Someone has moved the body, now I have to find it to complete this task. The women were there to embalm a friend--the last thing on their mind that morning was resurrection. Expectations....

The woman clearly saw the stone rolled away and the empty tomb, but then something more began to happen. As they are wandering about, two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. Angels. In their fright they bowed down and worshiped them, but these angels were there for a purpose, to deliver a message. In Luke 24:5 they speak, "why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here; He has risen." There it is—the first pronouncement of the resurrection of Jesus! The first declaration of "He is risen!" Unexpected words for these sullen women. They heard the words, but yet did not understand. They weren't expecting to hear from angels and they weren't expecting such news.

And yet isn't that what Easter is all about—Good News! The devil thought he had won on Good Friday, but there was a Sunday morning miracle coming. Jesus' victory is our hope. If Jesus doesn't rise from the grave, our faith is useless. We live without hope. But because He is risen, we know that He alone has won. He has overcome death and through Him we have a way home, a way to heaven.

The Good News, the hope of our faith is that Jesus Christ is risen. But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. His victory, our hope. Yes, the tomb is empty. Who would have thought that a grave site would be the symbol of eternal life? I love how God turned everything upside down. The religious leaders of the day who didn't believe in life after death got the shock of their lives. The tomb was empty. Nothing could hold the son of God, no coffin, no tomb, no cross, nothing. This Jesus whom they thought they got rid of had won. He defeated death and had risen. And with His rising there is hope. Expectations....

Friends, what are you expecting this Easter? Is it simply eggs, candy, baskets, and a fancy dinner? Or are you expecting something more? Are you ready to shout the Good News? Are you ready to declare, "HE IS RISEN!" My prayer for you this Easter is that all your expectations would be completely met in the wonderful news of Jesus Christ and His resurrection!


Children's Outreach Ministries Administrator's Update

There's always so much going on in Children's Outreach Ministries. We ended 2023 celebrating the birth of our Savior and started 2024 with a hopeful anticipation of all God will continue to do through our ministries. The beginning of February Wee Friends Preschool and Primary Program opened their registration for the 2024-25 school year. We have been overwhelmed by the response we've had to date, especially from new families in our area. It's always a blessing to see the families that return with each new child, but we are excited to know the reputation of these ministries is growing so much that new families from the community are inquiring about and joining our programs. Over the last few months, the children have been learning about Jonah, The Good Samaritan, John 3:16, and the Miracles of Jesus. We will be covering Daniel, Easter, Zacchaeus and Joseph in March and April. We invite you to look around the hallways as you move through the building on Sundays to see some of the children's work.

In January our CLASP/Summer CLASP Director Allysa Tantala gave her resignation to take another position where she could utilize her degree in Child Psychology more fully. Our staff has been amazing to rally together and help fill in some of the gaps. I'm reminded daily of how blessed I am to work with this group of women. We would appreciate your prayers as we search for a new Director and as we continue to move forward. Right now, we've opened summer registration and we're planning for Summer CLASP. There are many pieces that need to fall into place, and it is an encouragement to me to see how God is providing what is needed right now. The reputation of this program continues to grow as well, and we already have a few new children to add to those returning. CLASP mornings we've been working through a devotional about God and Science. The children hear so much about how science and God can't go together it is exciting to show them otherwise. They have such great questions; it is amazing some of the things they come up with.

Child Care continues to run at full capacity with a waiting list of families. We are praying about and exploring possible options to add another room in that building. There is not much room for growth but there is a huge need in our area for infant care. All the daycares in Quarryville are small, so if we could expand to create a bigger infant room, it would give us a chance to meet the needs of our community. Would you please pray with us as we seek God's direction.

I'd be remiss if I didn't recognize and thank the congregation of MGCOB for their support of Richie and the Metzler family the last several months. It has been quite a "roller coaster ride" for the family as they navigate the ups and downs of Richie's treatment and progress. Through it all you have continued to support them through prayer and tangible means. It has been a tremendous witness to them of the love and faithfulness of God. It again reminds me of how much of a partnership this is. Children's Outreach Ministries could not exist without you, and I can only pray the witness our programs has continues to grow the body of Christ here.








Join us Easter morning!




