#### Why We Gather

As you're reading this, spring as sprung in Southern Lancaster County and we're ready to jump into summer. One of my favorite parts about summer worship at Mechanic Grove is a sanctuary full of every generation. I love how we get a taste of both our traditional and contemporary worship services as we blend them together each week. We'll get to experience this again, as we combine worship services for the summer. We'll join together for Sunday School at 9am and then for our combined worship service at 10am. We will operate on this schedule starting June 2nd until September 1st. We will resume our regular worship schedule on September 8th.

I'm excited to worship again with you all in that combined format, but I am also excited about learning alongside you in a new summer Sunday School format for this year! In efforts to continue to encourage intergenerational discipleship opportunities and to foster mentoring relationships and gospel-centered community, Adult Sunday School classes will be combining with another Adult Sunday School class for July and August. That class pair will decide if they will utilize the D6 Curriculum for that two-month block or if they will explore another elective option. These Adult classes may get some surprise elementary and youth visitors throughout the summer!

Think about your time in your Digging Deeper Family Grow Group during the Lent season. We heard such great feedback from you about that time together. We're hoping that you'll get to experience some of the same in this summer Sunday School format. This also helps expand the teacher pool and give rest and flexibility to the current teachers, including Pastor Kevin and myself.

#### Children's Outreach Ministries Administrator's Update ~ Aliza Kraynak

**Wee Friends Preschool, Director Sharon Godfrey**: Registration for our 2024-25 school year began in February. Currently we have three less registered than we had for our current school year. That is amazing! We have not had that happen in the last few years, and are excited because in July and August we usually get another influx of registrations come in. We are confident we will exceed our numbers from the 23-24 school year. Many families are new to Wee Friends, and our COM website that Ed Heidinger created is reaping dividends not just for Preschool but our other ministries as well! Our last day of Preschool will be May 10<sup>th</sup> with our End of the Year programming held Monday May 13<sup>th</sup> for our 2- and 3-year-olds, and May 14<sup>th</sup> for our Pre-K. We are excited to show the parents and families all the children have learned and celebrate what has been a wonderful year!

**Primary Program (Kindergarten), Director/Teacher Sharon Godfrey**: It has been a great school year for Primary. The children have learned and gained so much over the last year. Our final day of school will be Wednesday May 22<sup>nd</sup>, with the End of the Year Program to be held Tuesday night May 21<sup>st</sup>. We are hopeful that with Richie Metzler home now that he will have the opportunity to rejoin the class even if it's only for a few days before the year ends. Registration for 24-25 opened in February and the class is already full with 16 children registered. All our programs have grown in their reputation within the community, but Primary most especially. We have never had the class full before the end of the current school year, so this is a very exciting thing. Again, many of our students are new to COM. Unfortunately, this will be the last year for Sharon Godfrey. She committed to this one last year to see a few siblings of former students through. Because of some health issues, she doesn't feel she can commit past the 24-25 school year but will remain on as the Wee Friend Preschool Director. Although we will be very saddened to see this ministry end, we are eternally grateful for the time Sharon has given over the last seven years and for the children and families she has been able to teach and impact.

**Child Care, Director Joan Cutler**: We remain at full capacity with 32 children enrolled, and 11 on our waiting list. Although we have 32 enrolled, not all attend every day. The maximum we can hold at our facility is 27. COM Board is praying about and exploring the possibility of making the one car garage into an additional room. All the daycares in the Southern End are small. There is a great need for infant care. If we were able to add an additional room to our facility, we could help meet the need that is there. We give praise that our reputation continues to grow, and that our new website is generating so much interest.

**CLASP** : In January our Director Allysa Tantala resigned to take a position as a school psychologist which is what she obtained her Masters for. While we were very excited for Allysa to have this opportunity, we were greatly saddened to see her go. Allysa had worked for COM for many years, initially as staff and then as Director. After a few months of searching for a new Director to no avail, the COM Board met to discuss options. At this time, I will be taking on the administrative responsibilities of the CLASP Director, and we have hired someone to oversee Summer CLASP which I will talk more about later. The last few months have been a little hectic, but I am so proud and grateful for our staff who have jumped in to help in any and every way possible. We are incredible blessed to have the women we do working here. Currently we have 28 children enrolled for the school year. Not all 28 attend at the same time, some come in the morning, some just in the afternoon and some are here for both. Because CLASP takes registration throughout the school year, we actually have picked up new students in the last few months. Again, our new website is generating inquiries, and the reputation of the program is growing in the community. The fact that Solanco will bus our students to Clermont and Quarryville Elementary is a great asset for us.

**Summer CLASP**: As I mentioned Allysa our Director resigned in January. We have been able to hire Kristin Garver to be the Director for Summer CLASP this year. Kristin has taught for 13 years in the York area. Initially she started in Elementary, has also taught Emotional Support/Special Needs and is now teaching Middle School. She is a seasoned teacher with broad training and experience in classroom management. We are excited to have her and I'm hopeful that Kristin will be able to return next summer as well. Enrollment opened in February and we currently have 22 children. The biggest influx will come in the next few weeks, and I am hopeful we will get a total of 30-35 children. We just had our first staff meeting last week, and we are excited for the summer. Field trips have been finalized. Some of the places we will be going are Zoo America, Christiana Underground Railroad Museum, State Capitol, Splatter and Glow in the Dark painting, Mid Atlantic Air Museum, and Reading Science Center just to name a few. In total there are 22 field trips planned and we will have a special Christian Ventriloquist show to celebrate our last day. I anticipate this will be a wonderful summer!

There have been many transitions this year in our ministries and there will continue to be more as the church renovation projects begin. We ask that you continue to pray for us as we go through them, that things will run smoothly with little interruption to the programming. Thank you for partnering with us as together we seek to meet the need of the families in the Southern End for God's good and glory.
